



A self-report tool to measure the well-being of adolescents with intellectual or developmental disability

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Currently tools for measuring the psychological health of children with an intellectual or developmental disability (IDD) are limited to proxy reports from parents or teachers. The Well-being in Special Education Questionnaire (WellSEQ) has been developed by The University of Gothenburg, Sweden as a self-report tool for adolescents aged 12-15 with IDD. The Children's Hospital at Westmead has been engaged in the development of an Australian version of this tool. The presentation will outline the research to date that has occurred in making the Australian version of WellSEQ available, and give a live demonstration of the interactive touch based questionnaire.
